Student Sign In/Sign Out

Keeping your children safe is one of our main priorities. For safety and security reasons, we need to know who is in the building at all times. We respectfully ask all visitors report to the office and sign-in before going anywhere else in the school. Also, if you are picking up your child for any reason during the instructional day, please inform the school and sign your child out at the office. When returning, please sign him/her in at the office. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in keeping our students safe.

Keeping Our Students Safe—Allergies and Medical Alerts

At Quaker Village, we have a number of students and staff who have life-threatening food allergies and other dietary restrictions. Even the smallest trace could be fatal. For this reason, we ask that families not send in food products containing **Peanuts** or **Tree-nuts** of any kind **Sesame Seeds** and **Eggs**. Although there are several nut-free substitute spreads on the market, we ask that these not be sent to school as it is virtually impossible to distinguish them from actual peanut butter.

Students are discouraged from sharing foods as this may result in a serious medical emergency.

We appreciate your understanding and support in keeping all our students safe at school.

Dogs on School Property

We recognize that dogs are an important part of life for some of our families and, as such, are often included in day-to-day activities such as walking children to and from school. In our teaching we promote the relationship between people and their pets and accept and encourage the idea of pets as 'family members'. We do see pet ownership as a valuable educational experience for children.

However, we have also received feedback from parents and staff indicating that many are finding the presence of dogs in the school grounds stressful, even frightening, particularly for younger children and those students with special needs. Many have expressed the opinion that a school playground is not an appropriate place for dogs and are concerned about the number of dogs on school property during morning drop off and afternoon pick up.

We are concerned that even well-behaved dogs can behave unpredictably when placed in a busy, noisy and crowded school environment and that this can lead to dog fights/snapping at each other. Children can also behave unpredictably when in the presence of dogs or when in contact with dogs and this can potentially lead to a child being bitten.

Therefore we are respectfully asking all families to leave their dogs at home and off school property. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.


Lack of these documents allows equal access to either parent.




reducing the number of cars on the road.

Good attendance patterns can become an important factor in a student's overall success at school.

Did you know?

- If your child is 20 minutes late every day, they will have missed 12 days of instruction by the end of the school year.
- If your child misses only two days per month of school, they will have missed one month of instruction by the end of the school year.
- Students who are absent 15 days of school each year will have lost one year of instruction by the end of grade 12.
- Students who attend school regularly tend to be more engaged in their learning, feel more connected to the school and tend to have better academic outcomes than students who miss a lot of school.

Families can support good attendance at school by:

- Setting a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Getting clothes, lunches and backpacks ready the night before.
- Communicating regularly with your child's teacher.
- Talking with your child about their school day.
- Taking part in school events and activities to show your child that you value school and education.
- Planning vacations and appointments around the school schedule whenever possible.
- Making sure your child goes to school, unless they are truly sick.





Act early! Let the school know right away if there is a problem or concern.

There are lots of ways we can work together to get attendance back on track or prevent an attendance problem from starting.
